

# ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD SCHOOL

## ROSEBUD BATTLEFIELD OF 1876



In cooperation with private landowners, and Montana State Parks (MTSP), the University of Montana is conducting an archaeological field school at the Rosebud Battlefield in Southeastern Montana. The Battle was a victory for the Sioux, Cheyenne, and their allies, and the outcome would largely determine Custer's fate eight days later along the banks of the Little Bighorn. Today the battlefield is threatened by coal mining operations in Southeastern Montana.

Participating students will be required to camp for two weeks, camping will be at Tongue River Reservoir, South of the Battlefield.

Students will learn metal detector survey, as well as excavation techniques.
