Dear Colleague:

The SHA 2023 Conference on Historical and Underwater Archaeology Committee invites you to join us in Lisbon, Portugal, for our 56th annual conference. The 2023 SHA conference will be held at NOVA University of Lisbon on January 4 -7, 2023.

Lisbon is one of Europe's oldest capital cities. The 2023 SHA Conference will be held at the School of Social Sciences and Humanities of the NOVA University of Lisbon. The venue is minutes away from both excellent food and historical monuments dating from the Roman Empire to the 20th century. Lisbon is one of the most historically interesting cities in Europe and was the capital of a major overseas empire from the mid-15th through late 17th centuries. The Portuguese Empire was directly responsible for initiating (from 1415) the European globalization that defines our period, and its influences include initiating commodity exchanges and population movements that are core to our discipline – also initiating modern plantation slavery on south Atlantic sugar plantations. The rebuilding of Lisbon after the shattering 1755 earthquake also left the city with one of the most important 18th-century urban landscapes in Europe. The city's recorded history dates back to the Roman period and the city's urban fabric includes remnants of the Roman city to 19th-century industrial developments. Prominent landmarks include the Belém Tower, the Jerónimos Monastery, and São Jorge Castle. Lisbon is well connected by air, rail, and motorway networks.

This year's conference theme, "Revisiting Global Archaeologies," draws on topics of inclusivity and multiplicity. The theme not only references the international location and outlook of the meeting, building on Lisbon's history as the center of one of the most significant global European empires of the early modern period, but also acknowledges the transformation of historical archaeology into a truly global discipline. Many European archaeologists also define 'historical' archaeology differently, noting that the historical record dates back to earlier periods, providing the opportunity to explore disciplinary definitions in a global context while still focusing on the post-1500 world. It is envisioned that the theme will encourage individual papers and symposia that address the increasingly global character of the discipline in the past, present, and future.

Formed in 1967, the Society for Historical Archaeology is the largest scholarly group concerned with the archaeology of the modern world (A.D. 1400-present). The main focus of the Society is the era since the beginning of European exploration. The SHA promotes scholarly research and the dissemination of knowledge concerning historical archaeology. The Society is specifically concerned with the identification, excavation, interpretation, and conservation of sites and materials on land and underwater. Geographically, the SHA emphasizes the New World, but also includes European exploration and settlements in Africa, Asia, and Oceania.

In addition to the presentations by archaeologists from around the world, the 2023 Conference will feature a Book Room with exhibits of products, services, and publications from companies and other organizations in the archaeological community. The SHA welcomes exhibitors who share its mission and agree with its Ethics Principles (<https://sha.org/about-us/ethics-statement/>), the SHA Sexual Harassment and Discrimination Policy (<https://sha.org/about-us/sha-sexual-harassment-discrimination-policy/>), and the Conference Code of Conduct (<https://sha.org/conferences/>).

If tables are available after the November 1, 2022 application deadline, Unmanned Browse Table applications will be accepted on a first-come/first-served basis determined by the date the Exhibitor Contract was received.

The SHA will not accept responsibility for shipping materials for exhibitors. Any materials remaining in the Book Room after 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 7, 2023 will be disposed of.

Each manned display will receive one (1) 6 foot skirted table and two (2) chairs. Unmanned tables will receive one (1) 6 foot skirted table. Each exhibit should be installed so as not to obstruct the view of, or interfere with, other exhibitors.

The fees for the 2023 Book Room are as follows:

Manned Tabletop Displays

(includes one full conference registration and one exhibitor staff registration*)

University Presses/Sister Organizations/Museums/Government Agencies/Non-profits\$250 per table
(includes one full conference registration and one exhibitor staff registration*)

Unmanned Browse Tables

Companies/Publishers/For Profit Organizations\$200 per table

University Presses/Sister Organizations/Museums/Government Agencies/Non-profits\$125 per table

*Please note that the exhibitor staff registration is intended for an individual who will be manning the Book Room table full-time. Exhibitor staff registration does not include attendance at conference sessions. **If you are presenting a paper at the conference, you cannot take an exhibitor staff registration.** Exhibitor staff are invited to participate in complimentary social events at the Conference.

All interested exhibitors must complete an Exhibitor Contract and indicate their agreement with the SHA Ethics Principles (<https://sha.org/about-us/ethics-statement/>), the SHA Sexual Harassment and Discrimination Policy (<https://sha.org/about-us/sha-sexual-harassment-discrimination-policy/>), and the Conference Code of Conduct (<https://sha.org/conferences/>). Please be aware that *space in the Book Room is limited* and preference will be given to Manned Tabletop Displays over Unmanned Browse Tables. If tables are available after the November 1, 2022 application deadline, Unmanned Browse Table applications will be accepted on first-come/first-served basis determined by the date the completed Exhibitor Contract was received. Full payment must accompany your completed Exhibitor Contract to ensure processing.

This packet will include conference registration and exhibitor staff registration forms as well as shipping information. **Registration forms must be completed and returned to the SHA office by November 30, 2022.**
